**Come to Shabbat Program with Rabbi Hollander at Temple Jeremiah  
11/10 – 11/12**

Temple Jeremiah invites the community to a weekend program of learning and sharing, “Conflict and Resolution: A Visit with the Families of the Bible,” with noted Rabbi Dr. Ben Hollander. Rabbi Hollander will speak at a Shabbat Service at 8 p.m., Fri., Nov. 10 on “Isaac and Ishmael: The Biblical Roots of the Middle East Conflict & Hopes for Its Resolution.” At Torah Study at 9 a.m., Sat., Nov. 11, Rabbi Hollander will look at “David and Bathsheba: Power and Its Abuse.” Culminating the weekend, he will speak at a brunch at 10 a.m., Sun., Nov. 12 on “I Am Joseph Your Brother: Conflict-Resolution Through Teshuvah.” All programs are open to the community at no charge and take place at Temple Jeremiah, 937 Happ Rd., Northfield.

A professor at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion’s Jerusalem campus, Rabbi Hollander specializes in hands-on Torah learning and its relevance to personal growth and the Jewish people today. A founding member of Rabbis for Human Rights, he regularly travels to North America to teach and speak at over 200 synagogues, communities, schools and retreats.

Temple Jeremiah is a Reform Jewish congregation affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism and holds weekly worship services and study programs. Its facilities are fully accessible.
