Join the Rabbi's Reading Table 2/19 & 4/16

Temple Jeremiah's Rabbi Paul Cohen will explore two fascinating books as part of the "Rabbi's Reading Table" offered at 3 p.m., Sun., Feb. 19 and April 16 at Temple Jeremiah, 937 Happ Rd., Northfield. The program is offered at no charge to the community.

On February 19, the reading group will look at the epic novel, *A Tale of Love and Darkness* by Amos Oz. Set in Palestine in the 1940's and 50's, the book follows the author's ancestors as they flee the Ukraine to settle in Palestine in the early 1930's and details the trials and tribulations they face there during World War II and the creation of a Jewish state.

The April 16 program will look at *The Cubs and the Kabbalist: How a Kabbalah Master Helped the Chicago Cubs Win Their First World Series since 1908* by Byron Sherwin. Both books are available at the temple's Gift Shop.
