Celebrate a Sabbath of Music with Temple Jeremiah at Shabbat Shira

Commemorate a special Sabbath of music as Temple Jeremiah, 937 Happ Rd., Northfield, hosts Shabbat Shira at 6:30 p.m., Fri., Feb. 10. The program, presented by Cantor Amy Zussman and the Adult Choir under the musical direction of David Lornson, will feature the life and beautiful music of Naomi Shemer. Considered the “First Lady of Israeli Song,” Ms. Shemer was a prolific song writer and composer who wrote such memorable songs as *Yerusahalayim shel Zahav* and *Al Kol Eleh*.

Shabbat Shira means “song of Sabbath” and celebrates the escape of the children of Israel from their bondage in Egypt to freedom, after which Moses raises his voice in song to give thanks to God.
