Gain fresh insights into the Mideast peace process when Israeli official Carmi Gillon speaks on "Jews, Christians and Muslims Partnering for Peace" at a Shabbat worship service at 8 p.m., Fri., April 27 at Temple Jeremiah, 937 Happ Rd., Northfield. A member of the Israeli Defense Forces and former head of Shabak, the Israeli Secret Service, Mr. Gillon currently serves as mayor of Mevasseret-Zion, a suburb of Jerusalem.

Mr. Gillon has written numerous articles on issues of state and security in Israel and abroad and serves as a television and radio commentator in Israel, the U.S. and Europe. His book, *Shabak in Tears*, was published in 2000. The program is open to the community at no charge.
