Temple Jeremiah Hosts Yom HaShoah Community Memorial April 15

In commemoration of Holocaust Remembrance Day, Temple Jeremiah, 937 Happ Rd., Northfield, will host a Yom HaShoah Community Memorial at 7:00 p.m., Sun., April 15. The program will feature music of the Shoah performed by our cantors and Jewish musicians.

Yom HaShoah is a day to mourn the loss of the estimated six million Jews who perished between 1933 and 1945 as a result of Nazi Germany's "Final Solution." It is a mitzvah to remember not only the loss of members of the Jewish community but the "Righteous Among the Nations," non-Jews who gave their lives trying to save those persecuted during the Holocaust. The community will gather at Temple Jeremiah to remember all who suffered during those dark times. This program is sponsored by the North Shore Fellowship of Rabbis.

Temple Jeremiah is a Reform Jewish congregation affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism and holds weekly worship services and study programs. Its facilities are fully accessible.
