Jan. 28, 2018	Tu B'Shvat Seder: Enjoy the traditional foods, meaningful readings, and enriching study that make up celebrating "Jewish Earth Day," the beginning of yearly regrowth and the blossoming of trees and plants in the Land of Israel.
Feb. 4, 2018	Pulse of Our World: Current events. Led by Rabbi Cohen.
Feb. 11, 2018	JUF Breakfast and Speaker: Breakfast begins at 9:30 a.m. and presentation begins promptly at 10:00 a.m.
Feb. 18, 2018	JDAIM: February is Jewish Disability Awareness and Inclusion Month. Engage in a "hot topic" around inclusion, focusing on some of the amazing work done by our Inclusion committee. <i>Led by Rabbi Heaps</i> .
Feb. 25, 2018	Sarajevo Haggadah: The Sarajevo Haggadah is an illuminated manuscript that contains the illustrated traditional text of the Passover Haggadah which accompanies the Passover Seder. It is one of the oldest Sephardic Haggadahs in the world, originating in Barcelona around 1350.
Mar. 11, 2018	Jewish Baseball Museum: The Jewish Baseball Museum, is a veritable Jewish baseball nerd's dream. The site, which launched this spring, is complete with biographies of nearly all the Jews who made it to the big leagues, dating back to the 1860s. <i>This is a joint program with Temple Jeremiah Brotherhood.</i>
Mar. 18, 2018	Seder Traditions: From the ridiculous to the sublime. As Passover approaches, families are not only thinking of what delicious recipes to try this year, but what they can bring to the seder to engage, entertain, and create memories for their guests. Please come with your own Passover traditions to share. <i>Led by Anne Lidsky</i> .
Apr. 8, 2018	Altalena: On June 20, 1948, the ship Altalena arrived in Israel carrying 930 World War II refugees. Also on board, ammunition amassed by Irgun in direct violation of Ben-Gurion's new military chain-of-command. Nearly igniting a civil war in the newly established country, Ben-Gurion gave the order to fire upon the ship. There will be a screening and discussion. Led by Jerry Lidsky.
Apr. 15, 2018	Book Review, <i>The Underground Railroad</i> : At once a kinetic adventure tale of one woman's ferocious will to escape the horrors of bondage and a shattering, powerful meditation on the history we all share. <i>Led by Ruth Adler</i> .
Apr. 22, 2018	Counting the Days of the Omer: Reflect on what Passover and Shavuot tell us about our place within the story of the Jews, and the place of Jews within the larger story of existence. <i>Led by Rabbi Heaps.</i>
